NYSPFP Progressive Mobility Initiative

o Purpose:

 Promote adoption of progressive mobility programs hospital-wide

o Aim:

 Accelerate improvement in a broad range of hospitalacquired conditions (HACs) and readmissions that are exacerbated by immobility and deconditioning.

o Target HACs:

 CAUTI, Delirium, VAE, Falls, Pressure Injuries, Readmissions, VTE, Worker Injuries

CAUTI	CAUTI Rate Per 1,000 Catheter Days	1.31	0.89	31.64%
Delirium	Delirium Prevalence Rate	17.05% (n = 62)	18.58% (n = 43)	-8.99%
Falls	Falls with moderate or greater harm per 1,000 patient days	0.072	0.077	-6.28%
Pressure Injuries	Pressure injury prevalence rate ≥ Stage 2 per 100 patients	1.38	1.77	-27.98%
Readmissions	30-Day All Cause Readmission Rate	12.80%	12.63%	1.32%
Safe Patient Handling	Musculoskeletal injuries from patient handling activity per 100 direct care providers	1.44 (n = 39)	1.41 (n = 34)	2.05%
VAE	VAE Rate	4.16	3.52	15.28%
VTE	PSI-12 Post-op VTE	3.71	4.11	-10.61%
