Workgroup updates

Thank you for your continued participation in EQIC's affinity <u>workgroup meetings</u>. See recent updates below.

Adverse drug events/opioid prescibing

At their Feb. 14 meeting, the group discussed current ADE measure data across the EQIC collaborative and congratulated hospitals for the improvement made across many of the ADE harm areas. Teams should review hospital-specific data to determine progress in the ADE measures. The group then reviewed the purpose and goals of the ADE rapid-cycle improvement program assessment tools.

Next steps for this group are to consider which ADE areas need attention and to complete an assessment on primary gaps and opportunities for improvement. Once the assessment is complete, teams should choose one opportunity for a Plan-Do-Study-Act cycle. The workgroup met again on March 13 in the new office hour format.

Readmissions

EQIC readmission workgroup participants continue to work on Plan-Do-Study Act interventions aimed at reducing preventable readmissions. At the Feb. 27 meeting, participants shared current work, challenges and successes and how they are collecting and using data to help identify trends in readmission risk and develop strategies to address these risks.

Additionally, hospitals are collaborating with skilled nursing facilities and community-based providers to meet the needs of those who are frequently readmitted or at high risk for readmission. The next workgroup meeting is scheduled for April 23.

Sepsis

The roadmap topic for the March 5 meeting was sepsis mortality. Jefferson Health presented on understanding and optimizing sepsis care through informatics and shared how they made sepsis an organizational priority by establishing an informatics-driven project team structure to standardize sepsis care, resulting in a significant reduction in severe sepsis/septic shock mortality.

The speakers discussed key factors for driving improvement using the electronic medical record and how the role of informatics and technology was transformative in leveraging their data, developing workflows and providing decision-support tools, predictive modeling and data analytics.

Interventions included rapidly implementing an enterprise sepsis solution through

emergency department early detection alerts, an Epic predictive model alert, sepsis navigator, a sepsis checklist with a timer, sepsis order sets and sepsis evaluation notes.

Team action steps to accelerate improvement include:

- establishing an informatics-driven project team and support structure;
- using human factors principles and expertise to design systems;
- implementing solutions to enhance team collaboration and workflows; and
- tailoring equity-focused interventions to identify and eliminate disparities.

The next workgroup meetings will be held as office hours on June 4 and Sept. 3.
